Just 3 Years Old, Manofmanymissions Retired:

(edited press release from Kentuckiana Farms)

The owners of the world champion and millionaire **Manofmanymissions** (Yankee Glide) have announced that he has been retired from racing and will begin his stallion career at Kentuckiana Farms in 2012. Kentuckiana, breeder of Manofmanymissions, will serve as the syndicate manager.

Manofmanymissions, the fastest 2-year-old and second-fastest 3-year-old son of the great Yankee Glide, retires from racing as the current 2-year-old world champion, having established his mark of 1:53.2f at Pocono Downs in winning 2010 Breeders Crown. In doing so, Manofmanymissions shattered the prior five-eighths mile track mark by nearly two seconds. At two, Manofmanymissions won four of six starts and earned \$432,900 with wins in the Kindergarten, International Stallion Stakes at The Red Mile and the Breeders Crown, defeating the likes of Broad Bahn, Pastor Stephen, Dejarmbro, Leader of the Gang, Swan in a Million and Big Rigs to name of few.

At three, Manofmanymissions accumulated nine wins and earned \$782,100, bringing his lifetime earnings to \$1,215,000. During his 3-year-old campaign Manofmanymissions established his lifetime mark of 1:52.1 with impressive wins in the Dancer Memorial, a Hambletonian Elimination, New Jersey Sire Stakes Final, Colonial Trot, Canadian Trotting Classic Elimination, Kentucky Futurity (in a heat and the race-off) and Breeders Crown Elimination.

In what has been labeled an "Instant Classic", Manofmanymissions showed a combination of extraordinary speed and courage, after having been passed in the stretch by Dejarmbro in both the second heat and final, to fight back to win both races in the most memorable Kentucky Futurity in recent years. "The way he battled back after giving up the lead in the stretch in both the second heat and race-off showed what kind of horse he is and what he is made of.

Throughout his career, Manofmanymissions maintained a great attitude and battled every time he went to the track.

"He is simply one of the toughest and most determined horses I have ever trained." trainer Erv Miller said.

Manofmanymissions was a spectacular \$215,000 yearling and hails from what many believe is harness racing's most prolific family. Manofmanymissions is a Yankee Glide son of the Garland Lobell mare Armbro Vanquish, 3, 1:55.4 (\$321,522), a brilliant stakeswinning daughter of the renowned broodmare Armbro Whirl. Armbro Vanquish is also the grand-dam of Manofmanymissions' rival, Dejarmbro.

The royal breeding of Manofmanymissions is prominent throughout his maternal line with a multitude of stakes winners in the first three generations. Specifically, the immediate family includes five millionaires, 13 winners of \$500,000 and 18 winners of \$250,000, including Manofmanymissions (\$1,215,000), Dejambro (\$1,129,885), Ambro Fling (\$1,334,936), Falls For You (\$1,311,152), Impeccable Image (\$1,288,593), Pizza Dolce (\$668,824), Southwind Allaire (\$733,534), Ambro Flori (\$571,711), Ambro Monarch (\$670,734), Ambro Officer (\$631,144) and Duke of York (\$882,528) -- to name of few.
